



Lancaster Road Primary School Behaviour Policy

At Lancaster Road Primary School we aim to create a welcoming, caring environment where all relationships are based on respect. We believe in enabling every child to achieve their full potential and to develop positive self-esteem. The staff at Lancaster Road Primary School are committed to maintaining high expectations of good behaviour as an essential contribution to the educational experience of the children and to their happiness and well being while in school.

The staff and children have worked together on a set of rules (It's good to be green code) that we use to underpin acceptable standards of behaviour. These are based on the basic values of honesty, respect, consideration and responsibility. It follows that acceptable standards of behaviour are those which reflect these values.

It's good to be green code

- We are kind, polite and helpful
- We consider the feelings of others
- We are honest
- We listen without interrupting
- We try our best, work hard and learn from our mistakes
- We look after property

It's Good to be Green Behaviour System

In each classroom there is a chart displaying the child's name and behind each name the child has 3 cards which are used alongside positive reinforcement of the school code of conduct:

Green card- The majority of children will have a green card displayed behind their name. This is because they have been following the code consistently. All children start each day on a green card.

Yellow card- Occasionally children will need a reminder of behaviour expectations in school. If a child needs reminding 3 times of our expectations they will be told to change their card to yellow. The class teacher will decide on a relevant sanction e.g. miss small amount of playtime. Children are able to work their way off a yellow card but an improvement in behaviour must be significant.

Red card- If a child continues not to follow the code, they will be requested to change their card to red. The child will then be seen by a member of the Leadership team. There will be

rare occasions where a child's behaviour will take them straight to red e.g. physical fighting and verbal abuse. Once a child receives a red card it is recorded and parents will be informed.

Rewarding Good Behaviour

At Lancaster Road we recognise the majority of children who are consistently following our 'It's good to be green' code. There are a number of ways in which this might happen.

- Positive reinforcements through stickers and certicards highlighting good behaviour and excellent work;
- Golden time/super green time;
- Messages to parents;
- Weekly celebrations assembly- An assembly to celebrate achievements of children. This will include giving out certificates, looking at excellent pieces of work (appropriate to the child) or achievements of children outside of school time eg swimming certificates, football trophies etc;
- Special certificates given out on a termly basis to children who have been on green all half term.
